Classroom Behavior Chart

Student choices are tracked on a Clip Chart. All students begin the day on green in middle of the chart. Their magnets are moved up or down depending on choices. Clips that are moved down may be moved back up if the teacher sees the student making improved choices. In addition, once a clip is moved up, it may be moved down. All magnets are moved back to green at the end of the day. Here is an explanation of each level of our Behavior Chart:

Outstanding Choice: Students move to purple for making outstanding choices. Classmates congratulate these students. These students are exceeding behavior expectations.

Great Choice: Students move to pink for making great choices. Classmates congratulate these students. These students are exceeding behavior expectations.

Good Choice: Students move to blue for making good choices. Classmates congratulate these students. These students are exceeding behavior expectations.

Ready To Learn: Students begin the day on green. They will move up or down depending on their personal choices. These students are meeting behavior expectations.

Think About It: Students move to yellow as a reminder that they need to follow the classroom rules. These students are working towards meeting behavior expectations.

Take A Break: Students who move to orange take a break from all activities to think about their choices. These students are working towards meeting behavior expectations.

Parent Contact: Students who move to red will get a phone call or a note sent home. They will have to get the note signed by a parent or guardian. These students are not meeting behavior expectations and their behavior needs improvement.
